Orange Farm community members rallying behind the Ntuli family at the Vereeniging Magistrate's Court in December demanding justice for Busisiwe Ntuli (35) who's in a coma after being severely assaulted by her boyfriend in November last year. The community is clear in its message that GBV won't be tolerated and have called for justice to prevail. Meanwhile, the Ntuli family has expressed gratitude

for the ongoing support from the Orange Farm community. The accused appeared in court for a second bail application on 4 January with the next hearing scheduled for the 1st of February. From food parcels to safety patrollers: EFF's Dr Mbuyiseni Ndlozi's festive impact in Orange Farm

During the festive season, Dr Mbuyiseni Ndlozi, a member of the Economic Freedom Fighters (EFF) Central Command and Member of Parliament residing in Orange Farm Ext 3, Ward 131, led various community initiatives alongside party members in the area.

Dr Ndlozi took a proactive approach by distributing over 2 000 food parcels to the elderly (aboGogo naboMkhulu) in the community. In addition to addressing the immediate need for food, he also employed a total of 146 patrollers who were strategically deployed in the ward to enhance residents' safety throughout the festive season. These patrollers worked diligently in two shifts per day and were compensated for their valuable services.

In a collaborative effort, Dr Ndlozi's mother, Ma-Queen Ndlozi, led EFF Ward 131's members and approximately 80 to 100 volunteers in operating soup kitchens across the entire ward. This selfless initiative continued throughout the festive season, with the team serving meals to an impressive 700 to 800 people daily. Emphasizing the significance of these efforts, EFF Ward 131's PR Councillor, Dumisani Dladla, told OFN "The soup kitchen was a serious intervention; no one knew that the need was this big until we started. A serious intervention is required, and people really need to be assisted. We still say that Orange Farm cannot thank Dr Ndlozi enough; he remains the only public representative from Orange Farm who has consistently remembered to give back to the community."

to secure employment and be able to fend for themselves and their children, we can eradicate GBV because some men who are breadwinners use their financial position to abuse women."

The organisation appeals to local businesses for support in further empowering and employing these skilled graduates. "We are proud to celebrate the accomplishment of these remarkable women and their dedication to improving their skills. Together, we can pave the way for a future brimming with opportunities," added Kapaso. 


