

## “Sikhathele ukuhlala namasimba!”



**NO MORE EMPTY PROMISES:** Residents are sick and tired of living in inhumane conditions demanding a permanent solution this ongoing nightmare

**Frustrated Ext 4 residents - near Madume Primary confronted Johannesburg Development Agency (JDA) on 26 August, over raw sewage that has been flowing through their yards for four years - turning everyday life into a nightmare.**

The stench, constant health hazards, and flooding during heavy rainy season have left families exhausted and angry. According to residents, the problem began after stormwater pipes were installed in the area, and despite petitions and repeated pleas for help, the situation remains unchanged. Community member, Nokuthula Mokgele, told **OFN**: “We have been living under these conditions for years, and we are tired. Every time it rains, we must sleep at other people’s homes because our yards are flooded with sewage, and we can’t enter. We have tried several times to get officials to fix this, but our cries have fallen on deaf

ears. In the meeting JDA asked for three weeks to come up with a solution, but we are not hopeful because promises are made but not kept. We want this sorted before the rainy season starts because it gets worse.” Residents say they are done with empty promises, demanding a permanent solution to this ongoing health and safety crisis.

### **JDA responds..**

The JDA, on behalf of the City of Johannesburg, has reached Practical Completion of the Orange Farm Ward 3 and 4 Bulk Stormwater Project. This project, part of the broader Orange Farm Bulk Stormwater Plan, included the construction of a bulk culvert network and an outlet structure to collect and discharge stormwater from the upstream catchment area - approximately 4km<sup>2</sup> - into a designated

natural channel.

Following the project’s completion, some residents downstream of the outlet have raised concerns about flooding during heavy rainfall. After a thorough review, it has been confirmed that the outlet structure and bulk stormwater culvert network were constructed according to approved designs and functioning as intended. The flooding issues are not due to engineering deficiencies in the project but are linked to environmental and maintenance challenges within the receiving natural channel. The channel downstream of the outlet is heavily silted and obstructed with dense reed beds, significantly reducing its hydraulic capacity and causing water to overtop the channel banks into adjacent residential areas.

To address this, the following actions have been recommended and are under discussion with relevant City

departments:

- **Desilting and clearing of the natural channel:** Municipal and environmental authorities will be engaged to remove accumulated silt and reed growth to restore the channel’s flow capacity.
  - **Alternative engineering solutions:** Should regular desilting prove unsustainable, a defined engineered channel may be considered to divert stormwater flows further downstream beyond flood-prone areas.
- A public meeting was recently held between the JDA, the City’s Environment and Infrastructure Services Department (EISD), the ward councillor and community representatives. Temporary interventions are underway, including dredging and clearing of the watercourse at the culvert outlet. These works will commence soon as the appointed service provider finalises arrangements to transport equipment to the site.

  - Assist or represent the child in legal, contractual, and administrative matters.
  - Provide or withhold legal consent for key decisions affecting the child's life, including:
    - o Marriage of the child
    - o Adoption of the child
    - o Travel outside the Republic of South Africa
    - o Application for a passport

These dances are more than performances; they are living expressions of South Africa's diverse cultures, each telling a story, identity and unity

These dances reflect the unique heritage of the different communities living in the area, keeping their history and identity alive through movement, rhythm and vibrant attire. Thus, for Heritage Month, **OFN** explores different traditional dances.

**Zulu:** Ukugida and Indlamu: The Zulu people celebrate their heritage with dances like Ukugida, a vibrant and energetic performance often seen at weddings and other significant events. Another notable dance is Indlamu, recognised for rhythmic foot stamping and high knee lifts, symbolising strength and unity.

**Xhosa:** Umxhentso is a traditional Xhosa dance performed during important ceremonies. Participants often wear beaded attire and engage in synchronised movements, celebrating their cultural identity and communal bonds.

**Sotho:** Mohobelo is the Sotho people's graceful dance of storytelling. Performed during various ceremonies, it showcases rich cultural narratives and artistic expression.

**Ndebele:** The Ndebele celebrate their heritage with Uhlanga during the Umkhosi Womhlanga (Reed Dance). Young women, adorned in colorful attire, dance to honor their culture and promote respect within the community.

**Pedi:** Dinaka, also known as Kiba, is the Pedi people's vigorous traditional dance. It is accompanied by rhythmic drumming and chanting, reflecting the community's rich cultural traditions.

**Tsonga:** The Tsonga community's Xibelani dance is a vibrant performance distinguished by hip-shaking movements and the signature xibelani skirt. It is performed during various celebrations and ceremonies, expressing the Tsonga people's cultural identity.


