### Lakeside's Mpho Chabatsane joins Pirates

**Mpho Chabatsane's journey to Orlando Pirates is a story rooted in resilience and a relentless love for football.**

Chabatsane was raised in a single parent household with three brothers and elder sister. As the youngest, he learned the values of discipline, humility and hard work early in life. He grew up first in Evaton then later moved to Lakeside, where football was not a luxury but a daily rhythm of life. Chabatsane went to Lakeside Estate Primary School and Matriculated at New Hope Secondary School. Speaking to OFN, he said "I think I was about eight-years-old when I started playing football on the streets where we played five-a-side with friends, later progressed to proper games with teams. Back then, I used to train with my brothers all the time." At 17, he joined Meyerton Rangers, competing in the Midvaal Local Football Association's League. After a season with the Rangers, he joined ABC Motsepe League's NWU AVA for the 2021/22 period. His breakthrough came when he was spotted by Matome who invited him to join JDR Stars, this move that marked his into the Glad Africa

Championship. Chabatsane spent three seasons honing his craft and gaining valuable experience. In the 2024/25 season, his career took another leap forward with a move to Marumo Gallants in Betway Premiership. Orlando Pirates Football Club, were impressed with his performances and sought his services for the 2025/26 season, signing him earlier this year. The Club said: "We are pleased to announce the signing of Mpho Chabatsane, as we continue to strengthen our squad ahead of the resumption of the 2025/26 season." The Buccaneers also acknowledged the role played by his former club: "We commend the leadership of Marumo Gallants for the professional and cooperative way the transaction was handled. We look forward to integrating the player into the group and believe he will add value and healthy competition within the squad." Paying tribute, Marumo Gallants said: "We would like to thank Mpho Chabatsane for his contribution and hard work. We wish him well."

# The real matric story in Orange Farm isn't just the pass rate



**When the Class of 2025 matric results were released, Orange Farm schools quietly delivered one of the most important education outcomes in Gauteng not because every school reached 100%, but because large numbers of learners stayed in school, wrote matric, and passed in a community where this has never been guaranteed.**

Orange Farm falls under Johannesburg South District (D11), which presented just under 4 700 full-time matric candidates for the 2025 National Senior Certificate examinations. Of those learners, more than 4 680 passed, placing the district among the strongest performers in the province. While the Department of Basic Education does not publish learner counts per individual school, Orange Farm schools make up a significant share of this total, with most local secondary schools entering between 120 and 300 learners each year. This scale is critical to understanding the results. At Thetha Secondary, a 98.9% pass rate translates into nearly an entire cohort passing matric. Leshata Secondary's 98.3% and Thamsanqa Secondary's 95.4% results similarly represent well over 100 learners per school completing Grade 12 successfully. Even schools with pass rates in the 80s, such as Orange Farm Secondary (84.1%) and Qoqa

Secondary (84.5%), still enabled dozens of young people to leave school with a recognised qualification. In Orange Farm, this matters because schooling does not happen in isolation. According to the Funda Uphumelele National Survey, fewer than half of South African households have access to books beyond school textbooks, and many learners study in homes where adults themselves did not complete matric. The survey shows that community-level learning support, peer study, and school-based intervention play a decisive role in whether learners persist through to Grade 12. That reality is reflected in Orange Farm schools' performance. District-level subject data shows that Johannesburg South achieved near-universal passes in English First Additional Language, with History and Geography also passing above 90%. In practical terms, this means that almost every Orange Farm learner who wrote matric was able to pass their language subject, a key predictor of overall success, especially in large cohorts. The Funda Uphumelele findings help explain why this matters. The survey shows that learners who develop strong reading comprehension and language confidence are significantly more likely to pass multiple subjects, even when resources are limited. In Orange Farm, sustained emphasis on reading, writing, and comprehension across grades has helped stabilise results and prevent widespread failure. Subject choice has also played a role. Mathematical Literacy recorded a strong district-level pass rate, enabling many learners to meet the requirements for Bachelor's Degrees, TVET colleges, teaching diplomas and entry-level public-sector training. In a community where immediate access to work or further study is often essential, this pathway has

helped keep learners in school rather than pushing them out through high-risk subject combinations. At the same time, the challenges are clear. Mathematics and Physical Sciences remain the subjects where Orange Farm schools struggle most. District data shows that Mathematics passed at just over 60%, and Physical Sciences in the low 70s. In large schools, even a small number of failures in these subjects can significantly pull down the overall pass rate. The Funda Uphumelele National Survey highlights that numeracy gaps begin early, often before learners reach high school, and are compounded by overcrowded classrooms and limited individual support. This helps explain why schools such as Raphela Secondary, Aha Thuto Secondary, and Vulcanindlela Secondary hover just below the 80% mark not because learners are disengaged, but because structural constraints remain unresolved. Independent schools in Orange Farm, including Imbali Combined School and Vutomi High School, achieved 100% pass rates in 2025. However, these schools typically enter much smaller cohorts, often fewer than 30 learners, allowing for close monitoring and rapid intervention. Their results demonstrate what is possible under different conditions, but they also underline why raw pass rates alone cannot be the sole measure of success in public schooling contexts like Orange Farm. Perhaps the most important figure is not the percentage at all, but retention. In a community facing unemployment, household instability, and economic pressure, Orange Farm schools succeeded in keeping thousands of learners in the system until matric, and ensuring that the overwhelming majority passed. The 2025 results show that Orange Farm schools are not merely surviving, they are

holding the line, using practical strategies to move large numbers of learners across the matric finish line. The data points to clear solutions: protect and strengthen language learning, expand Maths and Science support without penalising schools for offering them, and measure success by how many learners complete school, not only by headline percentages. In Orange Farm, the Class of 2025 is proof that when schools, families, and communities pull in the same direction, progress is possible even under pressure. **Story by Ottis Manyoba... @Ottiszm**

The Department of Basic Education does not publish public, school-by-school learner counts or subject breakdowns. # VAAL CRASH: Driver abandons bail, faces 14 counts of murder

This fatal crash has left the nation devastated, forcing authorities to tighten scholar transporter monitoring with several arrests nationwide

A 22-year-old driver, Ayanda Dladla, appeared before the Vanderbijlpark Magistrates' court on 22 January, in connection with the fatal scholar transport crash which claimed 14 lives. The accused abandoned his bail application and was charged with 14 counts of murder, 3 counts of attempted murder and charges of operating a vehicle without a certificate of

fitness. The case has been postponed to 5 March as he remains in custody. Authorities confirmed that 12 learners died at the scene, two others later succumbed to their injuries in hospital on 22 January. The truck driver involved in the crash escaped unharmed, while a passenger sustained injuries and is receiving hospital care. Police visited hospitals and the

mortuary to verify fatalities and injuries and are continuing investigations, gathering witness statements to determine the full circumstances of the accident.

## Hijack victim fights back, kills suspect

**A suspected car hijacker was shot and killed after an attempted hijacking in Orange Farm Ext 7a, on 7 January.** According to Orange Farms SAPS, the victim said, he is a local vegetable supplier and was selling vegetables in his vehicle when three unknown men approached him. The armed suspects ordered him out of his bakkie demanding cash. As attempted to drive away with the vehicle, the victim drew his licensed firearm and opened fire, fatally wounding the suspect in the driver's seat. The other two suspects fled the scene on foot. Orange Farms SAPS Spokesperson Sergeant Shaan Motsapi told OFN: "Upon arrival at the scene, police discovered the body of an adult male sustained multiple

gunshot wounds." Motsapi added: "the suspect was later identified by family members and transported to Sebokeng Forensic Pathology Services for further processing." A case of murder, carjacking, and possession of an illegal firearm was opened for further investigation. Orange Farms SAPS appeals to members of the community to assist with any information that may aid the investigation or lead to the arrest of the remaining suspects. Information can be provided anonymously via the MySAPS App, Crime Stop on 08600 10111, or by contacting Orange Farms SAPS at (011) 213 8023 / 8025 / 8026. Crime proved fatal as the deceased's funeral is today.

## Five nabbed after bodies of Andiswa and Nontokoza found in Poortjie

**SAPS has arrested five suspects in connection with the hijacking, kidnapping and murder of two young women whose bodies were discovered in Poortjie along Randfontein Road on 8 January.** The victims, Nontokoza Mazibuko and Andiswa Sontangane both aged 25, were reported missing from Evaton on 31 December 2025 after being last seen at the Pooe Soccer Grounds. Following a ransom demand to one of the victims' mother, the case was upgraded to include hijacking and kidnapping. Police acting on intelligence, traced and arrested four suspects in Evaton and a fifth in Germiston on 13 January. An unlicensed firearm was recovered.

Investigators also discovered the victims' vehicle abandoned at a car wash in Brits. The vehicle had false number plates but retained the correct license disc. Gauteng Provincial Commissioner, Lieutenant General Tommy Mthombeni, welcomed the arrests, saying the rapid action was a result of the coordinated efforts of investigative teams and community cooperation. Tshepo and Paseka Makobashe Sive Gwinise, Thabo Dfeto and Aute Motsapi appeared before Vereeniging Magistrates' Court on 15 January facing charges of kidnapping, hijacking and murder. The accused abandoned bail bid and opted to apply for legal aid. They are set to appear in court again on 25 February.



## DA: Stop ignoring Tjovitjo, residents deserve water, electricity and rights



The fight for service delivery continues as DA steps up

The Democratic Alliance (DA) continues to fight for informal settlements residents across Johannesburg. Tjovitjo Settlement has long been denied basic services and formalisation, even though funding and laws exist to protect residents' rights. This neglect is causing political tension and threatening democracy. Through council sittings, Section 79 Committee meetings, motions, and written questions, the DA has held the Government of Local Unity (GLU) accountable. These are not political demands – they are residents' constitutional rights. The DA has highlighted failures in providing water, sanitation, and electricity, both in the Human

Settlements Committee and on the ground. In July last year, a Motion on Formalising Informal Settlements was submitted to council but was ruled inadmissible by the GLU, leaving residents without change. Chronic government inaction has led to rising tensions. The DTT Development Task Team has threatened that if the settlement is not formalised by June, political parties will be barred from campaigning from 1 July, and voting may be blocked by November. The DA condemns these threats. Democracy must not be held hostage. The party urges the Department of Human Settlements to use available funds to upgrade Tjovitjo, providing water, sanitation, electricity, tenure security and dignity to its residents.

The decision sparked furious protests from Senegal's players, who temporarily walked off the pitch, causing a 14-minute delay as tensions flared between players, officials and match staff.

Senegal coach Pape Bouna Thiaw ordered his players off the field in protest, but captain Sadio Mané eventually intervened, persuading his teammates to return and continue the match.

When the game resumed, Morocco were handed a golden chance to take the lead. However, Diaz failed to score when the penalty was saved by Senegal goalkeeper Edouard Mendy.

During the extra time, Senegal gained their composure and began to control the game. At the 94th minute, midfielder Pape Gueye struck the decisive goal.

The goal proved enough to secure a famous victory and another AFCON title for Senegal.




