Home Affairs blunder leaves Ext 7b mother stranded



Julia Mokoena, 38, is a victim of Home Affairs ID duplication dispute

An identity number mix up at the Department of Home Affairs has left an Ext 7b mother without identity document, preventing her from working, accessing basic services or registering her children properly.

Julia Mokoena was informed that her ID number is linked to another individual in the Home Affairs system - this problem has effectively erased her legal identity. As a result, she is currently unemployed and not receiving any social grant. Mokoena told **OFN**: "I feel like I do not exist in my own country. I cannot work, access assistance, or register my own children properly because of a mistake that is not mine. My children are suffering because of this." The error has also affected her two children, who do not have birth certificates.

One of the children is living with autism and requires special care, placing further strain on family.

"As a mother, it breaks me to see my child needing special care while I am blocked by paperwork. All I want is for this mistake to be fixed so I can stand on my own and take care of my family." She added.

According to our research, the case come amongst ongoing challenges within DHA. As of late 2025, Minister Leon Schreiber, revealed that the Department is dealing with a backlog of over 4.4 million cases related to documentation and system issues. As a result, this ID number duplication placed the family under serious financial and emotional strain.

OFN contacted the DHA's spokesperson, David Hlabane, for comment and clarity as a way forward for this family. At time of press, he had still not responded.

This is a developing. **OFN** will continue to monitor the matter and keep our readers updated.

SOUTH AFRICA

Residents of Orange Farm and surrounding areas are urged to register online for the upcoming Local Government Elections.

The Independent Electoral Commission (IEC) opened the system for eligible South African citizens on 8 February.

The IEC says all eligible South African citizens aged 16 and older can register online, and those 18 and older will be able to vote in the elections

later this year. To register, residents must bring a valid green barcoded ID book, smart ID card, or South African passport. Officials will check the ID and capture personal details.

People can register online through the IEC portal, at local municipal offices, or at special IEC stations during registration drives. Online registration remains open until the official election date is proclaimed.

The IEC also encourages residents to check their registration status and make sure their details are correct so they are ready to vote.


According to Ronald Kapaso of Intouch Youth Development, the programme focuses on long-term empowerment rather than one-off food parcels. "When families are equipped with the right tools and knowledge, they can feed themselves with dignity and build sustainable livelihoods," he said.

By providing tools and training in organic farming practices, the programme aims to improve soil health, protect the environment, and enable participants to grow vegetables for home consumption and potentially generate small income from surplus produce. Beneficiaries say access to basic equipment has made gardening more manageable and productive.

Rachel Mabaso from Ext4 explained: "I will start planting so that we can chase away hunger and encourage others to grow their own food." Vuyiswa Mfobo added: "We truly appreciate the service we received - thank you."

Serious crimes rise in Orange Farm despite drop in murder



Orange Farm recorded 106 community reported serious crimes between October and December 2025, according to the latest third-quarter figures by SAPS on 20 February. The statistics, covering the 2025/2026 financial year's third quarter, measure 17 priority offences reported at police stations nationwide. Across South Africa, police logged 385 936 serious crimes, reflecting a 6,2% decrease compared to the same period last year. Contact crimes - which

include murder, attempted murder and sexual offences - accounted for 175 210 cases nationally. Locally, the picture is mixed. While the overall total climbed from 79 to 106 cases year-on-year, murders dropped significantly from 69 to 36 cases. The station further registered 8 attempted murders and 2 rape-related sexual offences during the three-month period. Armed robbery continues to weigh heavily on the community. Police recorded 44 robberies with aggravating circumstances, of

which 36 were residential robberies, signalling that households remain vulnerable. Property-related offences included 9 burglaries at homes, 1 vehicle theft, and a sharp spike in livestock crime, with 20 stock-theft cases reported. Although the decline in murders may signal progress, the increase in overall serious offences and sustained robbery levels suggest that crime remains an urgent challenge for Orange Farm residents.

Political violence sparks concern ahead of 2026 Local Government Elections

A recruitment drive by the Economic Freedom Fighters (EFF) in Ward 1, Orange Farm turned deadly on 14 February when two men opened fire on attendees. One member, Mphikeleli Xaba, was

killed, while Lucky Nkonyane, Matheza Sithole, and Lerato Majela were injured. The incident occurred during a Mass Recruitment Campaign as the party mobilises communities ahead of the 2026 Local Government Elections (LGE).

The EFF in Gauteng condemned the shooting, calling it an attack on its members and on democratic freedoms, including freedom of association and political expression. The party calls on the South African Police Service (SAPS)

and the Johannesburg Metropolitan Police Department (JMPD) to identify and apprehend those responsible. **The OFN team extends condolences to the Xaba family and wishes a full recovery to the injured members.**

Disciplinary process underway at Aha Thuto following stabbing of Grade 9 learner

A violent incident at Aha Thuto Secondary on 12 February which left a Grade 9 learner injured after being stabbed, prompted a swift response from education authorities. The Gauteng Department of Education (GDE) said the parents were immediately contacted and the injured learner was taken to a nearby clinic and later discharged. The alleged perpetrator was placed on suspension and a suspension letter was served to the parent on 13 February. Disciplinary proceedings led by the school's Disciplinary Committee are scheduled to commence on 24 February, where an appropriate sanction will be recommended. The school's Disciplinary Committee will begin proceedings on 24 February to recommend an appropriate sanction. GDE spokesperson, Steve Mabona, condemned the incident and emphasised the department's commitment to maintaining discipline in schools. "We strongly condemn any acts of misconduct which seek to undermine the dignity of our learning institutions. Schools are urged to enforce their codes of conduct to deal with disciplinary matters. The Department continues to appeal to parents to work closely with schools to instil discipline and respect among learners," he said. GDE also dispatched its Psycho-Social Support team to counsel affected learners and staff.

Learners at Siyaphambili and Vulcanindlela Secondary schools received crucial guidance as Vumane Projects visited the schools this month to raise awareness on teenage pregnancy, bullying and the dangers of unprotected sex. During workshops and interactive sessions, facilitators educated students on the risks of unsafe behavior, the importance of consent and ways to seek help when facing peer pressure or harassment. Vumane's Esther Denge told **OFN:** "Teenagers face many challenges today

and knowledge is their best defence. We aim to empower learners to make safe, informed choices and build supportive relationships." School staff welcomed the program, noting that community initiatives like this are essential in equipping youth to navigate complex social and personal issues. Vumane Projects says the campaign is part of ongoing efforts to raise awareness and empower youth with the information they need to make responsible choices.

SAPS destroys over 13 800 firearms in Vanderbijlpark



A significant step in curbing gun-related crime as weapons are permanently removed from circulation

On 19 February, the South African Police Service (SAPS) carried out the destruction of more than 13 859 firearms and firearm parts in a high-profile event in Vanderbijlpark, Sedibeng. The firearms and parts destroyed during the process were collected through policing operations across the country and subsequently forfeited to the State. In addition, a number of firearms were voluntarily surrendered by members of the public in ongoing efforts to promote community safety. The Sedibeng District Commissioner, Major General Adelaide Mukwevho, presided over the official destruction process, alongside Brigadier Nonhlanhla Sikhakhane, Acting Component Head for Firearm, Liquor and Second-Hand Goods (FLASH), and senior SAPS management. This marks the second firearm destruction process of the 2025/2026 financial year. Over the past seven years, SAPS has destroyed a total of 305 934 firearms, demonstrating the service's continued commitment to reducing the circulation of illegal and unwanted firearms in the country. "Each firearm destroyed represents a potential life saved and a step towards a safer South Africa," said SAPS.



“No Reblocking, No Vote”

Dear Editor

Last month, we as residents of Mountain View Ext and other informal settlements in Ward 6 reached a breaking point.

For years, we have listened to promises of development have come and go, carried on the wind of election campaigns and disappearing just as quickly once ballots were counted.

Mountain View Extension, Tjovitjo and neighbouring informal settlements we remain to live without proper reblocking, reliable access to water and adequate electricity infrastructure. Both previous and current councillors have failed to address these longstanding concerns. As residents we feel we are only visible during election season - counted as votes, but not served as constituents. That is why the message echoing across Ward 6 is clear and direct: “No reblocking, no vote.”

We have all agreed that if government does not implement reblocking in our area by 6 July, political parties will not be allowed to campaign within our affected area. This is not about supporting any political party. It is a unified stance from community who feel sidelined by successive administrations. We have sent a petition outlining our grievances to multiple government structures, including the Office of the Premier. At its core, our demand is simple: formal reblocking processes and the provision of basic services - water and electricity- for all informal settlements in Ward 6. We want to make one: our frustration must not be turned inward. As residents of ward 6 informal settlement, we have urged one another to remain united. Our struggle is not with our neighbours - it is with the public officials and service provider who we believe have failed to fulfil their responsibilities to us. The message we continue to share among ourselves is simple: solidarity among residents and firm accountability for those elected and appointed to serve our community. We are not asking for equitable service delivery and to be recognised as full participants in local governance. For us dignity begins with infrastructure. We can not speak of freedom when basic services are absent. With July approaching, tensions remain high in our community. But our position is clear. Until we see visible and concrete steps taken toward reblocking and the provision of essential service, political campaigning in our communities will be met with resistance. We stand united - not against each other - but in our demand to be seen heard and served.

R370 SRD grant to continue for another year



The Minister of Social Development, Nokuzola Sisisi Tolashe, has published draft amendments to the SRD regulations in the Government Gazette to extend the R370 COVID-19 Social Relief of Distress (SRD) grant for another year.

The monthly grant which provides a lifeline to millions of unemployed and low-income citizens was originally scheduled to end on 31 March 2026 but was continued by President Cyril Ramaphosa when he said it will continue from 1 April 2026 until 31 March 2027 during his State of the Nation Address (SONA) last week.

President Ramaphosa said: “Since it was introduced during COVID-19, the Social Relief of Distress Grant has kept millions of South Africans out of food poverty. As a transformative instrument to improve the lives of the poorest and most vulnerable people, this grant will be continued. This year, we

will redesign the grant to more effectively support livelihoods, skills development, work opportunities and productive activity.”

The published draft amendments are open for public comment allowing individuals and organisations to provide input before they are finalized.

“This extension is critical for many South Africans who continue to face financial challenges. We encourage the public to review the draft regulations and submit their comments to ensure the programme continues to serve those who need it most,” said Minister Tolashe.

Written comments on the draft amendments to the Regulations must be submitted within 21 days from the date of publication, which is 11 February 2026.
