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'Awarded for what exactly?'

Residents challenge Orange Farms SAPS honours

Orange Farms SAPS received district recognition - but the reaction from residents has turned the awards into a bigger story about trust, service and whether official praise matches what people experience on the ground.

OFN posted the awards article on Facebook after Captain Meyiwa received a special award and the detective unit was awarded as Detective Service Best Team of the Year at the Sedibeng District Excellence Awards on 4 September. The comments were immediate on "Awarded for what exactly?" Siyabonga Hlatshwayo asked.

Nelisiwe Gama wrote: "I'm still waiting for Orange Farm police even today." Vuyisile Yende questioned the process itself: "Why dont they validate from the community before making such awards?"

Tovarish Zulu went further, writing: "I disagree with the distribution of those awards. I spoke with an officer today who could not articulate the approach

to GBV. He told me I was politically campaigning when I pointed out that their GBV statistics do not accurately reflect the issues we face on the ground."

Other comments echoed the same frustration. Mpho Mashiane asked: "Excellence in certifying the documents? Ah" while Refiloe Fifi wrote: "Yoh Orange Farm police station with their bad service aii ngeke we really need De Deur police station it's the best."

There was also support. Zakhele Ndlovu wrote: "I think they deserve it.. because of the burden of criminals they face in OF and the effort they put big up to them...if it's not the amount of work they put OF will be a no go area.."

Sgt SJ Motsapi said the awards reflected the dedication, professionalism and teamwork of members. The reaction now raises a sharper question: when police are recognised for excellence, should the community's lived experience form part of that measure?

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R400,000 drive to secure permanent community centre

This Ext 6a based organisation is seeking R400,000 to buy the land where its community centre currently operates, aiming to move from a leased site to a permanent base.

Clean Touch Administrative Services supports children, young people, families and vulnerable residents through skills development, food security initiatives, youth programmes and social assistance. Its BackaBuddy campaign, titled From Lease to Legacy, was created to purchase the property and give the centre greater long-term stability. Organiser, Harriet Dladla, said the facility has become an important space for residents to access support and participate in community programmes. The fundraising drive encourages people to contribute whatever they can, with donations of R10, R20, R50 or R100 all helping move the campaign closer to its target. Supporters are also being asked to share the appeal widely to attract more donors.

SELTE seeks support for Eshowe outreach



A skills initiative supporting people with intellectual disabilities is seeking public assistance to extend its work from Orange Farm to communities in Eshowe, KwaZulu-Natal.

The SELTE DIY Special Education Skills Programme plans an outreach aimed at learners, parents and special schools, with practical training, employment, entrepreneurship and independent living at the centre of its approach. Organisers are appealing for help with transport to and from Eshowe, food and refreshments, an organisational banner and other outreach needs. The programme's message, "From Rejection to Opportunity", reflects its focus on addressing barriers faced by people with intellectual disabilities through practical skills and greater inclusion. Based in Orange Farm Ext 1, SELTE DIY says contributions will help it reach more families while continuing its work around confidence, independence and economic participation. Support can include funds, food, transport sponsorship or partnerships.

Mduduzi Gambu's move from handling fresh produce at Shoprite to building his own farming business has earned him a nomination at the 2026 South African Agricultural Awards. The 28-year-old Orange Farm farmer has been nominated in the Upcoming and Commercial Farmer category, with the awards set for 16 October at the Sandton Convention Centre. Gambu launched Farming with Gambu in 2022 after leaving his job and deciding to create his own income through agriculture. What started small has grown into a registered business producing vegetables such as spinach, cabbage, onions, tomatoes, kale, beans, beetroot and pumpkin. He is also expanding into poultry production. "The nomination is meaningful to me because it shows that the work I have been putting into Farming with Gambu is being noticed," Gambu told OFN. His journey has not been without setbacks. Limited funding, equipment, infrastructure, pests and crop losses have all tested the business, but Gambu says persistence has kept him going. He now wants to use the recognition to grow production, reach more customers and create opportunities for others in Orange Farm. "For me, it is also an opportunity to represent Orange Farm and demonstrate what can be achieved through agriculture, determination and entrepreneurship," he said.

Orange Farm hub tackles skills gap with first intake

Twenty Orange Farm youths have begun a six-week End User Computing and Administration programme at a new community training centre launched on 11 September at the OFUTA offices in Ext 2. The centre was established by Rhiza in partnership with the Orange Farm United Taxi Association (OFUTA) to provide local access to digital learning, workplace preparation and enterprise support. Lungile Khambule, Rhiza Babuyile Marketing Manager, told OFN the initiative responds to barriers that often leave unemployed youth with limited options. "If you cannot afford paying for further education or cannot get efficient work because you lack certain knowledge and skills to be absorbed in formal employment, you are stuck," said Khambule. She added that the launch marks "the beginning of a

deliberate effort to address some of the issues that negatively affect our communities in order to build better futures." Ward 3 Cllr Simon Molefe said the first group is only the start. "The programme aims to empower the youth of Orange Farm with skills that will help them develop their knowledge and open doors for them in the world of work," Molefe said. He explained that a new recruitment process will follow once the current six-week cycle is completed. OFUTA PRO, Monti Matsopa, said the partnership is about making development more accessible within the township. "If opportunities are brought closer to where people live, more residents have a realistic chance of taking part and improving their prospects," Matsopa emphasised. The centre is also expected to offer robotics, digital literacy, enterprise development and other technology-focused programmes.

Health checks, social support and key services available under one roof

Siyabaphilisa brings essential services closer to Drieziek 5

Residents of Drieziek 5 were able to access healthcare and government assistance in one place when the Siyabaphilisa outreach programme visited Solwazi Sports Ground on 4 September. Running from 09:00 to 15:00, the initiative is designed to reduce barriers such as long travel distances and limited access to facilities. Services included HIV and TB testing, immunisations, family planning, Pap smears, PSA screening, oral healthcare, chronic

treatment support, Vitamin A supplementation, deworming and Lenacapavir administration. Parents whose children have missed routine vaccinations are encouraged to attend. Home Affairs, SASSA, Social Development and Sport, Recreation and Culture will also be present, allowing residents to deal with several needs during one visit. "By bringing multiple departments together, the programme aims to make essential services easier to reach for people living in underserved areas," said Boitumelo Letlaka.

Austin channels heartbreak into new EP



Personal loss is shaping a deeply reflective project for Austin, whose upcoming EP explores relationships, missed connections and emotional recovery.

Lost Connection, due for release on 16 October, draws from different experiences of separation rather than one specific relationship, giving each track its own emotional perspective. "Lost Connection is one of my most personal releases to date," Austin told **OFN**. The project blends hip-hop with Afrobeat influences and features Dopey Dog and Poster, with Baylor and Kid Bronze contributing to production. Austin's approach shows how songwriting can provide a constructive outlet for difficult experiences while helping artists develop a more distinctive voice. By grounding the music in real emotions, the EP also creates space for listeners to connect with themes of vulnerability, acceptance and moving forward.



Fakaza702 refuses to be boxed

Sticking to one formula is not part of Sifiso Mabheba's musical plan.

Known as Fakaza702, the Ext 7a vocalist prefers moving between different corners of Amapiano. From soulful melodies to deeper private-school influences, Mabheba says exploring contrasting sounds allows each project to offer listeners something different. "I love to explore the music space and give people something fresh every time," he said. His previous release, Spanish Guitar, forms part of that experimentation, while his next offering, Send Location, is scheduled to drop on 30 September. Rather than confining himself to a single Amapiano style, Fakaza702 is using each release to test another side of his creativity. That flexibility could prove valuable in a genre that continues to evolve, while giving listeners a clearer picture of the range he wants his catalogue to represent.

Stallyss RSA wears three hats in entertainment

Known professionally as Stallyss RSA, the Drieziek 5 entertainer works as an MC, Amapiano vocalist and DJ, combining different roles to build his presence in the local music scene. Sithole said his focus is on taking his career to greater heights, expanding his profile beyond Orange Farm and carrying the community's spirit wherever he performs. His journey has been shaped by appearances at parties, community gatherings and private celebrations, where connecting with audiences remains central to his work. Moving between the microphone, vocals and decks gives him several avenues to pursue opportunities in entertainment. For Stallyss RSA, versatility is becoming a key part of building a sustainable career while growing his reach across South Africa.

Dankoww Marn creates platform for creatives



For Kamohelo Mosikili, better known as Dankoww Marn, entertainment is not only about putting on a good show - it is about creating a platform where local talent can find opportunities.

Based in Palm Springs, Dankoww Marn is an event organiser, entertainment entrepreneur and creative behind Mhlaba wama Kgashasha, a growing platform that aims to connect artists, businesses and the community. Through the initiative, he wants to create memorable entertainment experiences while giving emerging creatives space to showcase what they can do. "My vision is to create a strong entertainment brand, create opportunities for local talent and inspire young people to believe in their ideas and turn their visions into reality," Dankoww Marn told **OFN**. His ambitions reflect a broader goal of using entertainment as a vehicle for collaboration rather than focusing only on individual success. As Mhlaba wama Kgashasha develops, Dankoww Marn hopes to strengthen connections between local artists and businesses while bringing residents together through events and entertainment.



Jerry's years of training lead to US

A journey that began on the streets of Lakeside Ext 5 has reached an international stage, with dancer Jerry travelling to the United States after years of training and mentorship.

Jerry joined Cultural Programs in January, building on work he had already done under choreographer and youth mentor Sanele "Tom" of Tom and Jerry Dancers and Team Sanele. Tom said Jerry's progress came through discipline, consistency and a willingness to learn. "I am very proud of Jerry and how far he has come. His dedication to learn have helped him reach this milestone," said Sanele. For the local dance community, the achievement offers more than celebration. It shows how structured mentorship, access to programmes and sustained support can help young performers move from township spaces into international opportunities. Tom said the achievement should encourage young people across Orange Farm, Lakeside, Evaton and Soweto to keep pursuing their ambitions.

Izindaba zasekasi ziphila ku-YouTube



With a camera, a close-knit crew and stories drawn from township life, Lindokuhle Funani is creating his own space in digital entertainment.

The young Orange Farm creator runs the YouTube channel Skits By Lindow, where he shares comedy sketches and develops ideas inspired by everyday experiences. He is currently working on two series, The Last Day and Imfundo yase Kasi, alongside his brothers and sisters. Rather than relying on a large production team, the group is using collaboration, available resources and their own creativity to bring the projects to life. Funani's approach shows how digital platforms can give emerging creators room to write, perform and publish original material from their communities. The projects are also giving those involved practical experience in acting, filming and production while building a body of work audiences can follow online.



Hyphentis CA gives Hip-Hop voices a seat

What began in the schoolyard cyphers has grown into a platform where Drieziek 1 artist Thabiso Magazi is helping other creatives enter conversations about music, culture and the industries around them.

Known as Hyphentis CA, Magazi discovered Hip Hop in Grade 7 before progressing from freestyling and community performances to recording, production and broadcasting. Today, he co-hosts Writersbench on Sauma HD Radio with Jabulani "Jabby Jabz" Dlamini. Established in 2025, the programme provides space for emerging and established creatives while covering music, fashion, film, tourism and entrepreneurship. His involvement extends to BullGang, a streetwear and creative brand combining fashion, visual identity and Johannesburg street culture. Rather than limiting his contribution to performing, Magazi is applying lessons from cypher culture - participation, exchange and collaboration to create spaces where creative voices can be heard.



Ntaladipichi creates free platform for local talent

Limited spaces for emerging performers and small businesses to showcase their work are being tackled through a new community event led by Orange Farm artist and organiser Ntaladipichi.

On October 31, the Ntala Dipichi Foundation will host its first annual dance competition in Ext 10, alongside an open mic, Battle of the DJs and bicycle stance contest. The initiative deliberately combines entertainment with economic access: local brands are invited to trade free of charge, removing stall fees that can prevent smaller ventures from reaching new customers. "This event is part of giving back to the community. I want local talent to have a platform, and local brands can come and stall for free," told **OFN**. The motivational speaker, dancer and performing artist will also host a line-up of invited creatives, including Lawkid, Sakhile and Kananelo Dimples. The October event will test whether one shared platform can connect performers, entrepreneurs and audiences while creating more visibility for homegrown talent.



Tshidiso Olifant creates free platform for local talent

For Tshidiso Olifant, drawing faces is only one part of the picture.

The self-taught visual artist from Evaton West Ext 7 also wants his work to create opportunities for young people around him. Working mainly with pencil, charcoal and oil pastels, Olifant focuses on portraits and takes on commissioned pieces for clients. "I'm a young emerging artist with big dreams," he said. His next goal is to use the skills he has developed independently to support schoolchildren with art-related projects and encourage more young people to explore creativity. That community focus gives his artistic journey a wider purpose, linking personal growth with practical support for learners who may not always have access to guidance or resources. Olifant hopes to continue developing his technique, grow his client base and use visual art as a way to contribute to his community.

Mphethi Mahlatsi choir prepares for Segarona final

Months of rehearsals are paying off for Mphethi Mahlatsi School learners, who have advanced to the Segarona Competition final at the Soweto Theatre after maintaining high scores through several rounds.

The choir achieved 91% in both the choir solo and small ensemble categories before scoring 88% in the semi-final to secure its place in the final.

Choir conductor Bongani Maphanga credited the achievement to consistent preparation.

"The learners have worked very hard for this competition. Getting 91% in both categories and then 88% in the semi-final shows their dedication and the effort they have put into their performances," Maphanga told OFN.

Beyond musical development, rehearsals have helped learners practise teamwork, discipline and performing under pressure. The group will now focus on correcting weaknesses ahead of its appearance at the Soweto Theatre.

Dance is becoming more than an extracurricular activity at Masibambane, where learners are using performance to build confidence, discipline and teamwork.

The school's primary group placed second at a competition on 28 August, while the high school team took first place on 4 September at the LoveLife Centre in Ext 6a. Three dancers also qualified for the 2027 National Arts Festival in Makhanda, giving them a chance to

test their skills on a wider stage.

The school credited consistent practice and learner commitment for the results.

"Our dancers worked incredibly hard and represented Masibambane with pride," the school said.

The performances highlight how structured arts programmes can give learners a sense of purpose while strengthening creative skills beyond the classroom.

Envy Straws marks 10 years after surviving store closure



Losing a physical store did not end Siyabonga Shabangu's fashion ambitions. Instead, the Palm Springs designer found another way to keep local streetwear visible.

Shabangu founded Envy Straws Street Kulture while in high school in 2016. Four years later, he opened Stayleng, a retail space that brought several local clothing labels under one roof. Financial pressure and the impact of COVID-19 eventually forced the shop to close, but Shabangu returned in 2024 with a different approach - hosting a runway dedicated to homegrown brands and documenting the showcase on YouTube.

"I was one of the first to do a local clothing brand," Shabangu said. Now celebrating a decade in fashion, he is preparing The Last Lunch with Envy Straws and Friends, an event marking the milestone. His experience highlights how independent designers can adapt from traditional retail to events and digital platforms when funding limits physical spaces.

Youngsters uncertain about life after school were connected directly with organisations offering education, training and employment support during a session at St Charles Lwanga Education and Training Centre in Ext 7a.

Hosted by the Orange Farm Community of Practice, the initiative brought together BPS, the Department of Employment and Labour, City of Joburg, Harambee-SAYouth, South West Gauteng TVET College and other youth-focused organisations.

BPS's Mosiwa Malula told OFN, "Young people need more than motivation, they need access to information, networks, guidance and practical pathways."

The session gave attendees space to ask questions and explore routes into further study, skills training, entrepreneurship and employment. The collaboration also aims to improve referral pathways so young people can be connected to opportunities suited to their interests and abilities.
